Purpose of the position

The Senior Occupational Therapist will be responsible for the delivery of community based OT intervention to our disability clients, including those entering the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS). In particular, the position will be responsible for the prescription of a wide range of disability equipment (including wheelchair and seating prescription), minor and major home modifications and case management of those with complex physical and intellectual disabilities.

Core responsibilities:

Home based occupational therapy assessments including all areas of activities of daily living, mobility and independence:

- Equipment prescription and relevant clinical justification (basic equipment through to more complex specialised equipment)
- Minor and major home modification recommendations with relevant diagrams
- Recommendation of community based services
- Activities of Daily Living (ADL) assessments
- Equipment applications for a variety of government equipment programs
- Compensable client assessment, intervention and report writing

Communicating assessed needs clearly and precisely to client and funding organisations within appropriate time frames.

Providing clients with all available options / solutions within assessment brief and funding guidelines

Ensuring recommendations meet all legal requirements, including Australian Standards (where applicable).

Completing relevant paperwork relating to assessments (both clinical and administrative) to a high standard, including client file case notes.

Ensuring Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare of all staff including yourself.

Liaison with other community based organisations and GPs etc to ensure best practice in holistic client focused care.

Establish and maintain positive working relationships with clients, families, team members and other key stakeholders.

Consistently demonstrate best practice and a commitment to quality standards, proactively identifying needs for improvement and showing initiative in meeting these improvement needs.

Commitment to the ongoing development of the practice and its services.

Commitment to ongoing professional development within both work time and personal time, including maintaining up to date knowledge of evidence based practice.

Support and supervision of less experienced colleagues within the organisation. Willingness to share knowledge and promote team growth.

Assist with induction of new staff members as required and supervision of students.

Demonstrated experience in the assessment and case management of those with MS, Acquired Brain Injuries, Paraplegia and Quadriplegia, Cerebral Palsy, and complex physical and intellectual disabilities.

Demonstrated experience in the prescription of an extensive range of assistive equipment and/or services to enhance the independence of those with a disability.

Demonstrated experience in service identification and linking clients appropriately through onward referrals.

Demonstrated experience in minor and major home modifications including wheelchair accessible kitchens, bathrooms and toilets; stair lifts; ceiling track hoists; ramps; extensions; Environmental Control Units (ECUs) and vehicle modifications.

Extensive experience working with adolescents/adults with a physical and/or intellectual disability.

Demonstrated experience in postural assessment and seating prescription

Excellent communication and interpersonal skills to effectively engage with colleagues, clients and key stakeholders

Demonstrated customer service skills and a client-centred approach to healthcare

Exceptional organisation skills and the ability to work autonomously in a complex environment characterised by competing demands and tight timelines
